 - Prevention
 - Intervention
 - Postvention
- Categories
 - Infrastructure/Equipment
 - Personnel
 - Training



- Infrastructure/Equipment
 - Security Cameras
 - Most buildings upgraded to web-based, high definition cameras; can view cameras remotely
 - All buildings can view front entrance
 - Cameras on all buses



- Infrastructure/Equipment
 - Communication Equipment
 - Emergency Radios in the Main office/Attendance office;
 direct communication to law enforcement
 - "Blue Pull Stations": direct communication to law enforcement
 - All district Walkie-Talkies connected to Safety and Security Team



Initiatives

- Infrastructure/Equipment
 - Entry Systems
 - Upgraded door hardware
 - Can track entry into buildings
 - Can remotely lock and unlock all doors
 - Can immediately view area if alarm on door occurs

- Infrastructure/Equipment
 - Visitor Management System
 - Infrastructure in place; not yet fully operational
 - Electronically track every visitor
 - Runs background check on National Sex Offender database
 - Can check local warrant list.
 - Classrooms
 - All doors remain locked
 - Door windows should be easily covered, if necessary

- Personnel
 - Over past 6 years, increased Safety and Security staff from 3 to 29
 - Trainings include:
 - Federal Emergency Management Agency courses
 - Crisis Prevention Interventions
 - Verbal De-escalation
 - First-aid/CPR
 - Violence Prevention
 - All Emergency/Safety Policies and Procedures

- Personnel
 - Two School Resource Officers
 - Combined 26 years of experience as SROs

- Staff/Student Training
 - 17 Emergency/Safety Drills per year:
 - 10 Fire/Evacuation
 - 3 Tornado
 - 4 Emergency Drills
 - Shelter in Place
 - Lockdown
 - Evacuation/Reverse Evacuation
 - Table Top Exercise

- Student Training/Prevention
 - Sandy Hook Promise
 - "Start with Hello" for Elementary students
 - "Say Something" for Middle/High students
 - Mental Health assessments/referrals
 - Anti-depression/Suicide Awareness
 - Gaggle software on all high school students IPADS



- Staff Training
 - Safety Plans
 - All plans are approved by the Canton Police
 Department, Canton Fire Department, and the Stark

 County Emergency Management Administrator.
 - They are also in compliance with the State of Ohio,
 Department of Homeland Security, and the Ohio
 Department of Education.
 - Includes an Incident Command Structure for each building and the district.



- What happens if we have an active shooter?
 - Staff should implement "Run, Hide, Fight" protocol
 - Safety and Security team will set up a physical parameter around the building
 - District will use All-Call system to communicate with parents
 - "Lockdown Buckets" are in every classroom
 - LAW ENFORCEMENT WILL TAKE THE LEAD ONCE
 ON THE SCENE



- What happens in the days/weeks/months after an incident?
 - District Crisis Team
 - Facilitate the grieving or adjustment process
 - Stabilize the environment
 - Reduce the risk of negative behaviors
 - Limit the risk of further incidents



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
