RESOLUTION IN OPPOSITION TO OHIO LEGISLATION, H.B. 322, H.B. 327, AND H.B. 616

WHEREAS, Ohio House Bills 322, 327 and 616 have been introduced to amend and enact sections of the Revised Code regarding the “promotion” and teaching race, sex, and “divisive concepts” in Ohio’s public schools; and

WHEREAS, provisions within these bills are contrary to the values of the Canton City School District as expressed in longstanding Board of Education policy; and

WHEREAS, complex societal and historical factors contribute to the inequities our students and their families face, and rather than perpetuating disparities, the diverse Canton City School District must address and overcome institutional inequity, and provide all students with the support they need to succeed. “As such, the Board of Education does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex (including sexual orientation or gender identity), disability, age (except as authorized by law), religion, military status, ancestry, or genetic information (collectively, “Protected Classes”) in its educational programs or activities”, as clearly stated in Board Policy number 2260 – Nondiscrimination and Access to Equal Educational Opportunity, and other places in policy also related to employment. All three of these proposed bills obstruct the Canton City School District’s ability to follow our own policies. And

WHEREAS, Far from eliminating racism and discrimination as envisioned by the Board, these bills would perpetuate racism and discrimination, by limiting the concepts, ideas, and materials that may be taught and used in the classroom to combat racism and other forms of discrimination; and

WHEREAS, These bills are poorly written, allowing the State Board of Education and other entities not directly connected to our community to define concepts **they** find to be “divisive” or not “age and developmentally appropriate.” We remind the legislature that the only licensed educator currently on our State Board of Education opposes such practices and these bills. And

WHEREAS, The Board of Education is concerned that these bills seek to limit candid conversations about race and gender identity in our schools, spaces in which all children should feel safe and welcome. The Board of Education is further concerned that these bills, if passed, embrace fear, xenophobia, dishonesty, and would exacerbate a mental health crisis that already exists within our schools and community.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Canton City School District Board of Education believes that our state licensed professional teachers and administrators are best qualified to make decisions regarding the appropriateness of instructional materials and techniques in our classrooms.

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Canton City School District Board of Education strongly opposes Ohio House Bills 322, 327, and 616, and Directs the Treasurer to forward this resolution to the membership of the Ohio House, Ohio Senate, and Governor.
