What is Honesty in Education? What Does It Mean in the Classroom? What Can You Do?

Cynthia Peeples, Director of Honesty for Ohio Education

Cynthia is the founding director of Honesty for Ohio Education, a nonpartisan statewide coalition that believes every child deserves an honest high-quality education grounded in truth, facts, and diverse perspectives.

In her role, Cynthia advocates for honest education at the Ohio Statehouse, Ohio Board of Education, school districts, and higher ed campuses. She serves on the state board of the League of Women Voters Ohio, leads the League's Northeast Ohio REAL TALK program, co-chairs the Akron NAACP ACT-SO program, helps build capacity for cultural proficiency and inclusive education in her local school district, and serves as a board member of the Akron Civic Theatre.

Cynthia transitioned into nonprofit service while working as a news anchor in Texas, marrying her passion for storytelling and advocacy. She grew up in California and Hawaii, and holds a B.S. degree in Finance from The University of Akron.

How I Taught Honest History and Government and Why It Matters Glenn Cummings.

Retired from Hoover High School, Glenn taught Advanced Placement (AP) History briefly, and for the past nearly 30 years taught AP United States Government and Politics in various rural, urban and suburban districts. Public funds are used for individuals who opt out of public schools. There is no oversight by local elected boards of education. The emphasis is on individual choice, not the common good. Vouchers increase segregation and shift more of the burden for school funding to local taxpayers.
